Los Angeles County Mails 1.3 Million Notices to Voters Registered with No Party Preference *No Party Preference Voters Must Request Ballots to include Presidential Candidates for the 2024 Presidential Primary Election*

LOS ANGELES – Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk (RR/CC) Dean C. Logan announced that on Saturday, December 2, 2023, the RR/CC began mailing notices to 1.3 million voters registered with No Party Preference. The notice includes crucial information on how to request a ballot with presidential candidates in the March 5, 2024, Presidential Primary Election.

In a Presidential Primary Election, the political party determines whether No Party Preference voters may request their party's ballot — a process commonly known as “crossover” voting.

In the upcoming Presidential Primary Election, the **American Independent, Democratic, and Libertarian parties allow** No Party Preference voters to crossover and request their party's ballot to vote for one of their presidential candidates.

The mailed notice contains a postage-paid Crossover Request Form, which voters can complete and return by placing it back in the mail. Alternatively, No Party Preference voters can request a party's ballot online through the [Crossover Ballot Request Application](#), by calling (800) 815-2666, option 2, or while voting in-person at a Vote Center during the voting period for the election.

The **Green, Peace & Freedom, and Republican parties have closed** their Primary ballot, meaning voters must be registered with a specific party to vote for their presidential candidates. No Party Preference voters who want to receive a ballot for one of these parties must change their party preference by [re-registering to vote](#). Voters can update their party preference by re-registering online, submitting a voter registration application, or while voting in person at a Vote Center during the voting period for the election.

Voters requesting crossover ballots or re-registering with a party preference are encouraged to complete their request or re-register as soon as possible or by January 3, 2024, to ensure the initial ballot mailed aligns with the voter's preference. However, the RR/CC will continue to accept crossover requests and process registration updates throughout the entire voting period.
