

## Voting Rights Act . . .

The Federal Voting Rights Act requires that voting assistance be provided to voters who need assistance in a targeted language or who reside in an area with a high concentration of multilingual voters. Voters with limited proficiency in English can enhance their understanding and participation in the voting process through the multilingual program. Our department works with community groups through its Community Voter Outreach Committee to receive feedback on these services.

## Multilingual Voter Services

Multilingual Voter Services was established to provide translations and oral assistance to voters who speak : Chinese, Japanese, Korean, Spanish, Tagalog or Vietnamese. These services include:

**Bilingual Assistance Hotline.** Callers to this toll free number may request poll site locations, bilingual voter registration cards, absentee ballots and sample ballot booklets. Calls are answered in English. For assistance in your language, please ask to speak with an interpreter.

**Translated Election Materials.** This information is mailed to your home before every election.

**Bilingual Assistance.** Voters with limited English proficiency receive assistance in their language at targeted polling places.



## How to request translated materials?

When you register to vote, you may request translated written materials by checking box 11 on the registration form and indicating your language preference.

Anytime after you register to vote, you may call us at **(800) 481-8683** to request voter information in one of the six languages.

## As a Multilingual Voter you will receive . . .

**Translated Sample Ballot Booklet** sent to your home. A Sample Ballot Booklet is an exact image of the actual ballot you will see at the polling place. It contains a list of candidates, candidate information and measures. Your Sample Ballot Booklet will also tell you where to vote, how to request a vote-by-mail ballot, and instructions on how to use the voting equipment.

**Translated State Ballot Pamphlet.** This pamphlet includes information on statewide candidates and measures.

## Who may serve as a bilingual poll worker ?



Any registered voter may apply to work as a bilingual poll worker.

A bilingual poll worker must have the ability to speak and write English and speak one or more of the following languages: Chinese (Cantonese or Mandarin) , Japanese, Korean, Spanish, Tagalog or Vietnamese.
