County Employee Pollworker Program

What is the County Employee Pollworker Program?

The L.A. County Employee Pollworker Program (CPP) was developed in response to a nationwide pollworker shortage. The program enables County employees to serve on Election Day as a pollworker while still earning their regular daily salary. Approved as a permanent program in 2001 by the Board of Supervisors, the CPP has grown every year and has proven to be a great success.



Who can be a County Employee Pollworker?

A County Employee Pollworker must meet the following requirements:

1. Employee of L.A. County
2. United States Citizen
3. 18 years of age or older
4. Registered voter in California
5. Has supervisor's approval

What are the Program Benefits?

- Receive your daily departmental salary PLUS a pollworker stipend of up to \$175
- Meet a MAPP behavior expectation through County Pollworker Service
- Help out your community in a time of need

Pollworker Responsibilities?

Pollworkers are expected to serve from 6 a.m. to approximately 9:30 p.m.

Election Day responsibilities include:

- Help set up the polling place
- Process voters
- Help close down the polling place
- Count ballots

Is Training Provided?

One month prior to Election Day, training is provided Monday-Friday (and some weekends) with numerous training classes located throughout the County.

Remember, attending a Pollworker training session is important.

Completing training accounts for \$25 of the election day stipend.

Are you bilingual?

Did you know that there are seven official languages in L.A. County? You can help out voters in your community if you speak any of the following languages:

- Chinese
- Japanese
- Korean
- Spanish
- Tagalog/Filipino
- Vietnamese
