

## How Should I Prepare for Election Day?

- You are expected to serve the ENTIRE day, from 6:00am-9:30pm! Please do not schedule any events on Election Day
- Attend a training session prior to Election Day
- Arrange transportation to and from the polling place ahead of time
- Dress comfortably and casually (no attire with political affiliations)
- Bring snacks and beverages to last throughout the day (Please note, meals are not provided)
- You will receive your check 4-6 weeks after Election Day

## What is the Student Pollworker Program?



The Los Angeles County Student Pollworker Program provides high school students with an exciting opportunity to serve as pollworkers on Election Day!

Responsibilities include:

- Setting up/opening polling place
- Processing voters
- Closing the polling place
- Counting ballots

## What are the Program Qualifications?

1. 16 years or older
2. U.S. Citizen (Sorry, under Ca. law Permanent Residents are not eligible)
3. Good academic standing
4. G.P.A. of 2.5 or greater
5. Must have teacher and parental consent
