WHAT IS THE COUNTY EMPLOYEE ELECTION WORKER PROGRAM?

The L.A. County Employee Election Worker Program (CEEWP) was developed in response to a nationwide election worker shortage. The program enables County employees to serve on Election Day while still earning their regular daily salary. Approved as a permanent program in 2001 by the Board of Supervisors, the CEEWP has grown every year and has proven to be a great success.



WHO CAN BE A COUNTY EMPLOYEE ELECTION WORKER?

A County Employee Election Worker must meet the following requirements:

- ★ Employee of L.A. County
- ★ United States Citizen or Legal Permanent Resident (Green Card Holder)
- ★ 18 years of age or older
- ★ Registered voter in California (If U.S. Citizen)
- ★ Obtain supervisor's approval

Volunteer election workers must comply with legal restrictions imposed upon them including, but not limited to, restraining orders, restrictions imposed on registered sex offenders, or any other prohibitions or limitations on their presence at voting locations and must notify the County immediately if they are prohibited from serving at their assigned voting location.



WHAT ARE THE PROGRAM BENEFITS?

- ★ Receive your daily departmental salary PLUS a Election Worker stipend
- ★ Meet a MAPP behavior expectation through County Employee Election Worker Service, if applicable



ELECTION WORKER RESPONSIBILITIES?

Election Workers are expected to serve assigned days and hours.

Responsibilities include:

- ★ Assist with opening and closing the vote center
- ★ Assist with processing voters
- ★ Answer voter questions
- ★ Proof of service is available upon request



IS TRAINING PROVIDED?

Six weeks prior to voting, training is provided Monday-Friday with numerous training classes located throughout the County.

County Employee Election Workers will be scheduled for training during work hours once they have been given an assignment.
