



INMATE VOTING

Did you know that you may still have the right to vote if you are incarcerated?

If you are a United States Citizen, at least 18 years of age at the time of the next election and a resident in Los Angeles County, you may be eligible to register and vote while incarcerated.



If You Are Currently Incarcerated You **may** register and vote if:

- Awaiting or on trial for a criminal offense and not convicted.
- Serving time for a traffic or misdemeanor offense.
- Serving time in a local jail as condition of probation due to a suspended sentence for a felony conviction.

You may not register and vote if:

- Already convicted of a felony offense and serving a sentence in a Los Angeles County facility or State prison.
- Still on probation/parole for a felony conviction as condition of your release from prison/jail.



Register To Vote

- Complete an Inmate Request Form and Write "Voter Registration Form" next to "Other".
- Complete Voter Registration Form. Include your permanent/ home residential address in box 4 & 5.

Include your jail mailing address in box 7 & 8.

- Make sure registration form is complete and signed.
- Mail Voter Registration Form. No postage necessary.



Request A Vote By Mail Ballot

- Complete an Inmate Request Form and Write "Application for a Vote By Mail Ballot" next to the choice "Other." If you are not registered to vote yet also request a "Voter Registration Form".
- Complete the Vote By Mail Application. Include your permanent/ home residential address in box 3. Include your jail mailing address in box 5.

- Be sure to sign your Vote By Mail application before you return it.
- Place the application in a stamped envelope and mail to:

NOTE: If you are not registered to vote, make sure to send your Voter Registration Form along with your Vote By Mail application. Place the application(s) in a stamped envelope. Do not seal the envelope.



Important Vote By Mail Information

- You can request a Vote By Mail ballot any time starting 29 days before the election and no later than 7 days before the election.
- Voted ballots must be returned before the day of the election. Your ballot must be received by the election office no later than 8:00 p.m. on Election Day. Be sure to mail back your voted ballot early.
- Remember to sign the back of the Vote By Mail Ballot Return Envelope so that your vote is counted.

IMPORTANT: If you requested a Vote By Mail ballot and are released before you receive it, you can still vote! Go to your polling place. Find your polling place online at www.lavote.net. Request a *PROVISIONAL* ballot.



If You Were Recently Released From Custody

- You must re-register to vote when you finish serving your parole/probation for a felony.
